***From your 1<sup>st</sup> Vice***

***Tuesday, September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001***, The day that ended the lives of several thousand unsuspecting, innocent Americans. This event has changed the way a nation continues to live each and everyday. ***9/11***, also known as “***Patriots Day***”, a day when terrorist groups from abroad, made a clear statement to citizens of the ***United States of America***, of their intent to wage war against our Country and its People. As you read this

article today, our Military Men and Women are overseas fighting these terrorist groups to prevent future attacks on our people and the people of countries such as Afghanistan and Iraq.

On **September 11<sup>th</sup>, 2001**, four airline passenger planes were hi-jacked by foreign terrorist. These planes crashed into three of four targeted buildings. These acts resulted in causing catastrophic destruction and loss of thousands of innocent lives. The hi-jacked planes were flown into both towers of the World Trade Center and the Pentagon Building. On the fourth plane, a band of terrorists was prevented from carrying out their mission. Thru acts of heroism and bravery, the hi-jackers were overtaken by the passengers of the plane. However, their lives were lost when the plane crashed into a farm field in western Pennsylvania. There were no survivors. It is believed that this plane was to be flown into our Nation's Capital Building in Washington, D.C.

Since **9/11/2001**, your American Legion Post has performed a Remembrance Ceremony each year. Tuesday, **9/11/2007**, marked our sixth consecutive year in performing this solemn, yet meaningful task. This Ceremony is conducted in accordance with the A.L. National guidelines. Its purpose is *to remember, honor, and pay tribute* to those victims, whose lives were lost, during the horrific acts of terrorism perpetrated on **9/11/2001**. Additionally, we honor and pay tribute to the Fire Department and Law Enforcement Personnel, who valiantly risked and lost their lives trying to rescue the victims of these attacks. We also remember our Military Personnel who are currently fighting the "**War on Terror**" to protect our freedom.

It has been my pleasure to serve as the Master of Ceremonies for a second consecutive year. Our special and honored guests, were *Chuck Austin*, President of the Earleigh Heights Volunteer Fire Company. Accompanying Mr. Austin was *Chief Paul Demasky*, *Lt. Luke Palmer* and *Firefighter Michael Conway, Jr.* Additional special and honored guests included, *Sgt. Coking* of the Anne Arundel County Police Department and Anne Arundel County *Sheriff Ronald Bateman*, with *Major Rick Tabor*, his second in command.

The Ceremony began at approximately 11:45 am. *Chuck Austin* performed a Fire Department tradition

known as "**Striking the Four Fives**". Mr. Austin rang the bell four times, pausing, and then repeated this process four more times. This tradition is performed to communicate that a firefighter's life has been lost in the line of duty. This tradition dates back to the 1800's and is still used today. *Edward May, Jr.*, Post # 175 Commander, *Barbara Mallonee*, Auxiliary Unit # 175, 1<sup>st</sup> Vice, and *Chuck Austin* placed a Ceremonial Wreath in honor of those remembered on this day. *Dale Strait* performed the duties of the chaplain by giving prayer and Benediction during the Ceremony. "**Taps**" was played on Bugle by *Andre Milot*, Post # 175, Sgt.-at-Arms. The Ceremony was brought to conclusion and a luncheon was held in the Post Lounge immediately following the Ceremony. The Auxiliary hosted the luncheon with food provided by the Post. I extend to all who took part in making this Ceremony a success, a sincere "**Thank You!**"

At this time, I would like to announce that our Post has installed a **POW/MIA Table** setting to honor our **Comrades** still un-accounted for. ## **We Want Your Old Eyeglasses**

Chances are that you have at least one pair of old unused eyeglasses on the shelf because you didn't want to just toss them. The **Severn River Lions Club** has an easy solution for you. The club collects old but useable eyeglasses and hearing aids for recycling. Twice each year all the Lions clubs in the district (Anne Arundel, Howard, Baltimore City and county, and Harford county) sort the glasses that have been collected. At the last sorting Lions boxed nearly 75,000 pairs of used eyeglasses. These are boxed and sent to an eyeglass reclamation facility in Virginia where they are sanitized, graded for prescription, marked and packaged for use in third world countries. The eyeglasses are given to needy vision impaired residents in these countries and help them see and be able to function with better vision.

The Lions also collect used hearing aids which are refurbished and offered to needy people through the Towson University Speech and Hearing Center.

Where do I drop off my used eyeglasses or hearing aids? There is a colorful eyeglass collection box near the stage in the bar area of the Legion hall. On your next visit bring your used eyeglasses and drop them in the collection box.

The Lions thank you and a recipient somewhere in the world who receives your used eyeglasses to improve sight thanks you.

## **Severn River Lions Fruit Sale Benefit set for 2007-2008**

The Severn River Lions Club again is set to offer select Florida citrus each month from November through March.

The Lions offer premium fruit from H & S Citrus, shipped directly from the orchards to Severna Park.

Ruby Red grapefruit is offered every month. In November and December, naval oranges are in season. In January, naval oranges are typically in season. Otherwise, we offer tart, tangy and sweet temple oranges.

We expect grapefruit to remain at \$16 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$28 for a 4/5 bushel box.

Naval oranges run about \$15 for a 2/5 bushel box and \$26 for a 4/5 bushel box. We expect the cost of tangerines (in January) to be about \$10 per eight-pound bag and temple oranges to be about \$16.

We will have exact prices closer to actual sale dates.

All proceeds go to school scholarships and local charities.
