It's that time of year again, **Membership Renewal**. I would like to remind every member that it is **everyone's responsibility to promote membership**. I also invite all our members to join me to find new members, as well as encouraging current members to maintain their membership in our Post. Again, I personally encourage all of you to help our Post to achieve our membership goals in the coming year!

You all should have received your 2008 membership renewal cards in the mail. In case you did not know this, your membership cards are printed by the Department of MD and then, are sent to our Post for processing and issuing to you when we receive your yearly dues payment. Your yearly dues start the divvy it up process at this point the post gets only \$9.50 of your payment. The rest is then split between Department and National. Please check your name and address on this form. If there are any mistakes, please write in the corrections on this form when you send it to our Post. This helps us to keep our records updated and additionally, we can inform the American Legion at the Department Level, of the necessary corrections to their records. Even if you pay your dues at the Post in person, we ask that you return this form to us with your payment. Those of us, who process your membership here at the Post, appreciate your cooperation to this request. I would like to extend to any member who has some time available, the opportunity to learn how the membership rolls are maintained here at the Post, to contact me and I will put them to good use in doing that job (instruction available).

Also, remember that renewing your membership as soon as possible is important. Why is this important? There are several reasons! First and foremost for Military Veterans, members of our Congress make laws that affect Veterans Administration Benefits. When the American Legion National Commander and his Staff appear before Congress and the Senate to lobby for or against legislative bills, the strength of our membership directly affects how strong their voice is, in representing you the Veteran (currently 2,700,000 strong). Quite simply put, **the greater the American Legion's Membership is, the Stronger our National Organization's Lobbying Voice is to influence our Law Makers on Capital Hill.**

Secondly, your prompt membership renewal supports your Post by achieving membership goals set by the Department that are used to determine whether a Post is classified as a three or four Star Post. Attainment of early membership renewal goals presents a good image regarding your Post in the eyes of the American Legion, within our County, District and Department of Maryland leadership. **Again, it is strength in numbers.**

Third, by renewing your membership early, you should feel personal pride in knowing that your money is used to support not only your Post, but Military Veterans of all ages.

On a more personal level, early renewal earns you the **Early Bird** designation on your membership card. Aside from personal pride, this designation **will save you money.**

Now that I have your attention, I would like to announce the date that you're Post will be holding its **Annual Early Bird Bull and Oyster Roast**. The Roast will be held on **November 3rd, 2007**. Please plan to attend this Great Annual Event. For this event, those **legion members** who carry a membership card with the **Early Bird** designation will again be given the "early bird only purchase" window **AND will pay \$ 5.00 less for their tickets than will a member without this designation.** It is you're Post's way of thanking you for renewing your membership promptly. **Additional details about this event will be posted in the October/ November issue of our Post Talk Newsletter.**

From Your Chaplain

Have you ever felt that God doesn't hear your prayers? Have you felt that you are too small to make any real difference in this world to anyone/? I have certainly had such feelings. But then I am reminded of some scripture that tells me that although my God is a BIG God, he is interested in small and personal things. And although I will never be a king or a president, or anyone famous, I can still make a difference. In

chapter 139 of the Psalms and in verse 16 we find that God has every day of our life written in his book. I believe he listens to our prayers no matter how insignificant they may seem to us. He is interested in us. In Luke chapter 21 and verses 1-4 we have a story about Jesus and his disciples watching people giving money to the church or temple. The rich put in a goodly amount, but then an old widow came along and she only put in two pennies. Jesus said that she put more in the pot than the rich guys: "... for all these out of their abundance have put in offerings to God, but she out of her poverty put in all the livelihood that she had." Is God interested in small things, you can count on it.

During WWII a 5-man bomber crew was hit by a German fighter on the way back from a bomb run. They heard the bullets hit the metal of the plane, including the fuel tanks or close to them. The bullets should have ignited the fuel and the plane should have blown up into a million pieces. But that did not happen and they crossed the Channel to land at their base in England. When inspecting the plane it was discovered that five bullets did indeed hit the plane. However, instead of being loaded with the explosive tips the bullets were loaded with wads of paper. When they opened the wad of paper they found a little message. It read that they were forced Polish labor and that "this isn't much but it is all we can do when the Germans are not watching." NOT MUCH, unless you were a member of a 5-man bomber crew! Mother Theresa was a tiny, frail, little old nun who had the courage and faith of giants. She said: "don't ask God to do big things, but small things with great love." We do indeed make a difference, not necessarily with big things, but rather with the small things we do.
