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**FROM THE CHAPLAIN**

Our Post anticipates taking part in the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade in Severna Park once again this year. Come and join in the parade. This is a really joyous event. If you can't walk or ride in the parade at least consider observing it from the sidelines.

Celebrating the birth of our country brings to memory many events and heroic people surrounding the history of our War for Independence. And so we remember that great American hero, Israel Bissell and his message: “To arms, to arms! The war has begun.” What, you don't know Israel Bissell? Well, frankly, neither did I until I recently ran across an article on his great ride calling the Colonists to arms. Bissell was a young 23 year old postal rider. He began his ride on April 19, 1775 and rode day and night with little sleep from Boston's western edge to Philadelphia, a 345 mile journey. Paul Revere was one of dozens of men who raced on horseback to spread the word. In response to their cries, church bells were rung and muskets were fired. British redcoats were attacking. The American Revolution had begun. The 20 mile gallop by Paul Revere became known to every American schoolchild because of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow. Why did Longfellow write about Paul Revere, and not Mr. Bissell? Well, says a Syracuse history professor, Robert Thompson: “Paul Revere rhymes with a lot more than Israel Bissell, and it is one of those poems that gets in your head and won't let go. It has a meter like the gallop of a horse. It's like taking the ride yourself.” And so, there were no bells pealing for Israel Bissell whose ride was obscured in history's annals by that famous 11-verse poem familiar to generations of American schoolchildren: So through the night rode Paul Revere. And so through the night went his cry of alarm to every Middlesex village and farm, a cry of defiance, and not of fear. A voice in the darkness, a knock at the door, and a word that shall echo forevermore..

As we celebrate our freedom and independence we might also wish to ponder another interesting speculation made by Alexander Tyler, a Scottish history professor at the University of Edinburgh. About the time we wrote a Constitution in 1787, Professor Tyler had this to say about the fall of the Athenian Republic in Greece some 2,000 years earlier: “A democracy is always temporary in nature; it simply
